To be held at **Canberra ACT** on the *6th* ~~18th~~ day of ~~October~~ *December* 2019 it is the intention of the priest-in-charge, church wardens and parochial councillors of the **Parish of Tarcutta** to promote an ordinance (under the Ordinances Initiation Ordinance of 1937 as amended)

To provide for:

The sale of the Union Church, Mate Street, Humula NSW.

The Union Church at Humula has not been used for worship or pastoral services for eleven (11) years and will no longer be used. The proceeds of the sale are to be used to support the Adelong Tarcutta Partnership, as well as ministry and mission in the Tarcutta Parish.

The land sale ordinance will be prepared in accordance with the information supplied on this notice.

Objections

Anyone who objects to the proposal in respect of the property must deliver their objections to the Registrar (Email: trevor.ament@anglicands.org.au or Post: GPO Box 1981, Canberra ACT 2601) within 4 weeks from the date on which this notice is first displayed.

The objection must state the basis of the objection and include the name, address and telephone number of the objector or objectors and may include an electronic mail address or fax number.

An objection on the basis that a portion of the proceeds from the sale of the property will be required to be paid to the Pelican Foundation must be rejected by the Registrar.

An objection received by the Registrar must be forwarded as soon as practicable to the ministry unit or the Diocesan Agency, to the Area Dean or relevant Archdeacon and to the Property Trust.

The Ministry Unit or the Diocesan Agency may provide to the Registrar such comments on any objection as is considered appropriate.

The Humula Anglican church building in Mate Street has not been used for worship or other pastoral services for over 11 years. This is indicative of the sign of the times we now find ourselves living in. The Parish Council and the Priest in Charge have decided to sell the building and ground. This decision has been approved by the Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn, of which the parish of Tarcutta is a part of.

To keep the church building operating would require a number of Humula church members to form a Committee, for them to be licenced by the Bishop to preach and conduct worship every month, maintain and clean the building and grounds, conduct bible studies or pastoral services, and hopefully reach a congregation of at least 30 people. In our current circumstances, we don't consider this can be done.

The proceeds of the anticipated sale will be used to support the ministry and mission of the Church in Tarcutta, Humula and Mundarlo. It will also be used to support the great partnership that Tarcutta church has with our Adelong church.

We have placed some notices around the district, including on the notice board at the ?????, plus on the church front door, and on the notice board in the church at Tarcutta. This is a legal thing we have to do, so that legally anyone can send an objection to the sale to our Diocesan Registrar.
